205-17 Apologies

209-17 Chairman's Report

The Chairman reported that formal contracts for the sale of the Old Black Horse pub had been exchanged and it was hoped to have an open evening on 22 March 2018. It had been confirmed that the knotweed had died but it will need checking again in the near future.

It has been noticed that chevrons had been painted on the junction of High Lane with Mapperley Lane. The Clerk was asked to contact the County Council to seek clarification on what works are proposed.

Concern had also been raised over the number of potholes in the village particularly on Mapperley Lane and the Clerk was asked to chase this up with the County Council.

210-17 Clerk's report

- a) The Clerk reported that two items of play equipment need to be taken out of use owing to damage. She had contacted the Borough Council to ask if they could repair but unfortunately no reply had been received. She will try again.
- b) The library in the village is being used by residents and no more books are required for the time being. She would like to thank Elaine Sarson for keeping an eye on the kiosk.
